PRESIDENTS REPORT

Disjointed, stop-start, frustrating - three adjectives to describe how the 2021/22 season played out on the field. The previous season we reported that the kindness of the weather gods meant we did not lose any games to inclement weather, an extremely rare occurrence— well, the 2021/2022 season was payback time!! Over the season for weather reasons, we had 6-7 games (depending on where the game was being played) either cancelled or abandoned without a result. To rub further salt into the wounds, at the tail end of the season the escalation of the Omicron variant of the Covid -19 virus saw numerous teams across the Metro & Junior competitions withdraw due to lack of players. Hence the stop-start and generally frustrating feel to the season. But having said that, on the field there was some excellent cricket being played.

We entered five teams in the Christchurch Metro Cricket adult competitions, one up from last year and five teams in the Christchurch Junior Cricket Association competitions.

Our top team, playing in the Championship grade (one below the top Premier grade) continued our strong showing in this grade, finishing third overall and reaching the finals and semifinals of the T20 and One Day competitions respectively. No silverware but, as the saying goes, you need to lose finals to win them, so hopefully our finals showing over the last couple of years will bear fruit next season. Certainly, the success of the team was based around strong form from some of the “veterans” and the continued development of some of the younger team members. We hope this blend of old and youth will continue next season when we welcome a couple of overseas players into the fold, the first time of being able to do for a couple of years.

Our Blues side playing in the top tier of the afternoon grades were a very new squad at the start of the season. They battled at times, both on the park and in getting numbers to the field but, to their credit, when the chips were down, they fought clear of the relegation zone to ensure Sumner CC will be represented in this prestigious grade again next year. We hope to see many of this team back again in the 2022/23 season.

The Clink Bar & Restaurant Presidents team presented the customary season of extreme highs & lows. Consistency is not a term synonymous with this team, but that really is the nature of the grade where injuries and “other” commitments largely determines the makeup of the team on a week-by-week basis. None the less, there are always performances which never cease to amaze, giving flashbacks of players in their glory days!! Special mention to two members of the team who were selected to represent New Zealand in the inaugural Over 60’s World Cup Cricket being held in Australia in September 2022. Andrew Nuttall is a regular in this team as well as representing NZ in the Over 50’s team. He is joined by Sumner Cricket Club legend, Ray Steele who dons the Silver Fern for the first time. Best of luck to these fine gentlemen.

The Mighty team waded into new territory in 2021/22. Having conquered virtually all of the 40 over grades over the years, they decided to have a crack at the shorter version of the game and entered the Cavaliers T20 competition. They were placed in the top Division and justified this by reaching the final, falling just short of taking yet another grade title out – no doubt a target for next year!!

Making their debut for the Club this year was a new team, also playing in the Cavaliers grade but in Division 3. Dubbed The Wave, the team was a bunch of fine young men, primarily from the all-conquering Sumner Rugby Colts team. Hopefully the lads enjoyed their season – it was certainly a challenging one for them and this team was the hardest hit by Covid issues late in the season. We hope to see this team back for another crack next year.

The Junior section of the Club fielded five teams in the Christchurch Junior Cricket Association competition. Leighton Murray stepped up and took over the coordination of the Junior Club with the support of the team coaches & managers. The ranks of the Juniors were swelled notably by the introduction of Friday evening Have A Go sessions. These were pitched as an introduction to cricket for four- to six-year-olds and were an outstanding success with numbers being capped at 25 participants. It turned into a real family affair with parents and siblings enjoying a

summers Friday evening down at St Leonard's with associated benefits, namely the bar being open and doing a roaring trade!! We look forward to growing this excellent concept and to the participants graduating to competition teams.

The Have A Go program was initiated and run by Marcus Thompson with help from a number of volunteers and parents. This illustrates how clubs such as Sumner Cricket function, being totally reliant on the volunteered input of time and energy. It is appropriate therefore to highlight and to thank those that roll their sleeves up and do the mahi. This starts with the Committee who are charged with the day to day running of the Club as well as the plotting our course as we move forward. The members of the Committee are listed at the start of this Annual Report and can I take this opportunity to thank every one of them for their time and input over the past twelve months, which to be fair, have presented some significant challenges. The makeup of the Committee is skewed somewhat to the more "experienced" end of the age spectrum - we are mindful of this and certainly would like to encourage new faces with fresh ideas to join us. Aside from the Committee, there are those that take on the role of organizing and managing each of the teams, at times a challenging and frustrating role particularly when faced with the inevitable Saturday morning player withdrawal and the scramble to fill the gap. In the Junior ranks, each of the teams are managed and coached by parents, some of whom have been doing this role for a number of years. This can be a wonderfully rewarding undertaking as you witness and steer your young charges through their childhood cricketing experience. So, to all those who contribute and actively participate in the running of Sumner Cricket Club, a huge heartfelt thank you – we would not and could not survive without you.

This is a timely place to mention one of the above whose massive contribution to Sumner Cricket over many years was officially recognized with the granting of Life Membership. This award is not given lightly and has, over the 116 years of the club only been bestowed twelve times, with Dan Vann being the lucky thirteenth recipient. Further details on Dans contribution to Sumner Cricket is outlined elsewhere in this report.

Off the field Omicron impacted the Club significantly. We were unable to run or participate in any of the main three fund raisers we are involved in each year. This restricted our sources of revenue to subscriptions, sponsorship, and a partnership agreement with Christchurch Metro cricket. Consequently the 2021/22 season ran at a loss of approximately \$13,500. Fortunately, we have sufficient reserves to cope with this however we would not want this to be a recurring occurrence and we look forward to better paying our way in the 2022/23 season. This result highlights the importance of our members being diligent and timely in the payment of their annual subscriptions. As a club we have purposely kept our annual membership fees at the lower end of the scale so to not be a disincentive for playing. Most of our members pay when requested but it is disappointing when we need to spend time and energy chasing Club members for subscription payments. The message here is that the Club needs your subs payment so please pay it on time.

TEAM REPORTS

THE 1ST XI (Championship Grade)

The Summer senior team had a pretty strong season finishing 3rd overall (2nd T20s, semi-finalist 1dayers, 3rd in Two day competition), so it was a little disappointing to not come away with any silverware to show for it.

It was great to welcome some new faces into the team debuting this season. Gaurav Vij was outstanding at the top of the order scoring a ton early in the season and showing his class with 498 runs. Bharat Sarpal, Akki Rikky and Mark Reid all made great impressions and will be valuable assets to the team next season. So to individual performances where Boston Fielding continued to pile on the runs all season and ended the overall top run scorer by a fair margin with 770 runs, including a brilliant 109. He was well supported by Henry Winchester who notched up his first ton for the club and scoring 504 valuable runs. Gaurav Vij, Brett Taylor, Anton Smail, Ben Cameron and Dan Vann all made important contributions with the bat as well.

The bowling group all played a key role and contributed all season. Dan Vann edged closer to the 500-wicket milestone with 43 wickets, just pipping Simar Kang at the end of the season to take the most wickets. Simar's left arm orthodox spin was exceptional especially as it was his first full season bowling spin for the club, having made his mark in previous seasons with left arm seamers. Simar took 42 wickets including 6/22! Henry Winchester was a consistent and economic wicket taker with the new ball and Nawid Mohamady had his best season to date and showed his growth as a player. Aditya Puri and Boston Fielding also made significant contributions taking wickets and tying down the opposition batters. Ben Cameron was exceptional as always with the gloves and even better leading the charge with banter, knowledgeable and engaging chat about the local cuisine, bus routes and real estate markets! Anton Smail continued to throw himself around in the field and took a couple of absolute speccys that we have come to expect from him over the last few years!

We look forward to building on this momentum for next season and bring home some silverware. We will be welcoming a couple of overseas players from the UK for the first time in a number of years, post Covid lockdowns.

As has become customary for the President's XI, the 2021/2022 season was a bit of mixed bag, with some occasional struggles to assemble enough fit and able bodies due to injuries, Covid and post-Christmas holidays, balanced with some outstanding performances with the bat and ball.

Our most prolific runmaker of the season was Paul Russell, with a total of 485 runs and a high score of 142, with a further century to his name. Marcus Thompson ended the season with a tally of 378, with a top score of 106. Julian Marsh was not far behind with 357, having reached 50 five times. New recruit Darron Reekers started his career with the Pressies with a blistering 129, but it turned out to be in vain as Sumner went on to lose that game. Other notable performers with the bat were Freddy Owens with three fifties, Josh Heke with a first pressies fifty and a swashbuckling 96 not out for Nathan Robinson.

With the ball, Sadat Abassi was the leading wicket taker with a total of 21 wickets and a best performance of 6-26 against East Shirley Strikers. Claims of calls to bookmakers prior to the game proved to be unfounded. Freddy Owens' leg spin claimed 16 wickets with a best of 4-11, clinching the runner up spot. Your correspondent followed up with 14 wickets and Nathan Robinson 10. Let's hope that next season sees a few more five fers.

Keeper Ray Steele took home the fielding award with ten dismissals (7 catches and 3 stumpings), but there were notable performances from Nathan Robinson (8 catches) and Paul Russell (6 catches).

Nathan Robinson's all round performances and stoicism in the face of a number of ducks earned him the Personality of the Season trophy. When we have located the trophy, I'm sure he'll be pleased to collect it.

The Pressies youth policy of Todd Mayo & Louis Malcolm saw them turn out when numbers were low, it was a pleasure to see some threes run with no injuries suffered.

Injuries of note were sustained by Andy Crump (finger), Kyle Skene (pride) after a twenty something year absence from the cricket field saw him hit his first ball to mid off, and Jimmy Spud, whose injury was psychological after his first outing for the Pressies saw him face the slowest bowling imaginable, which he then hit straight to mid wicket.

The season ended with a Covid induced forfeit, so I hope that when October comes around Covid restrictions will be a thing of the past and we'll see some familiar faces on the field along with some of the newer recruits.

SUMNER CRICKET CLUB FINANCIAL REPORT 2021/22

At the time of printing the annual report, the financial statements (profit and loss account and balance sheet) are not yet available unfortunately. However, the financial situation of the club is clear as outlined below.

We started the financial year with assets around the \$89,000 mark but these have reduced by approximately \$13,500.

We did not pursue any non-casino trust funding, but we benefited from two small partnership grants from CMCA.

Sponsorship is increasingly difficult but we were very pleased to welcome Mitre 10 Mega Ferrymead as our principal sponsor for our Junior Club in an innovative joint support of both the Sumner Junior Cricket and Rugby teams. This sponsorship enabled the Club to purchase new junior playing shirts resulting in our junior teams looking very smart out on the field. Other Club sponsors are Little India, Pizza Republic, Party Warehouse and HireKing.

COVID again had an impact this past season. The Committee decided not to proceed with the annual fundraiser in March, being the Des Lyons Day, which saw us raise \$5,500 the previous year. We look forward to November 2022 when a big effort will be required to support this venture.

Subscriptions received increased but this is in line with the fact that we had an additional team in "The Wave" in the Twenty/20 competition. In saying that, "The Mighty" also went from playing one day forty over cricket to Twenty/20 cricket which meant their team subscriptions reduced.

Junior team numbers have been on the decline also but the introduction of the Friday night "Have A Go" programme counteracted this.

Groundsman costs / ground maintenance (seed, fertiliser and fuel) continue to be our major expense along with playing equipment, and clothing, although a lot of the clothing is self-funded.
